On January 06, 2024, he was released from the rehabilitation center, not because he'd already recovered but because his family decided to discontinue the program due to financial reasons. I started sharing God's word with him, and that genuine repentance is the first step. I told him he must ask for God's forgiveness, sincerely acknowledging his sins and making them right. At first, he was reluctant to reach out to those he had done wrong because he was concerned about what others may say about him.

He contacted my dad, apologizing for what had happened between us. My husband and my dad are not on good terms. They have not been talking since the day my dad rebuked him once about our situation. My husband is a very proud man; he never listens to anyone but himself, but seeing him now humbling himself to my dad, I knew God has started to work and transform him little by little. God Answered My Prayer

In Nursing, obtaining a Monday through Friday job in a hospital setting is very difficult. Hundreds of nurses fight for the same jobs, and often, you are lucky to get an interview. Most nurses need to apply as casual staff first, then slowly move up to part-time and eventually full-time in these sought-after roles.

I applied for a full-time position in the Heart Function Clinic. It is a clinic job that monitors patients who have heart failure. This clinic has a small team of only two nurses for the entire hospital. The current nurse, who was to be replaced, had been in the role for 18 years and was retiring. Hundreds of nurses applied. I committed it to the Lord, applied, and was blessed enough to receive an interview. I tried to prepare for the interview by asking the other nurse in the clinic for a copy of the teaching package they use for patient education so that I could familiarize myself with the role. She refused to help me and even lied that such a book did not exist. Thankfully, I have a lot of cardiac experience as I have worked in Cardiology, the Coronary Care Unit, and The Cardiac Surgery ICU. I thought I would rely on my ability.

My interview was on a Monday. On the Sunday prior, at church, my sister told me to ask for prayer for the interview. I did not think I needed prayer because I relied on my ability (what a mistake). Thankfully, I listened to her, and the church prayed. Pastor Nelson said, "I gave you the job," and told me to place the prayer request in my bible. I wish I could say something spiritual, like I put the request in a scripture of promise, but that was not the case; I just threw it in my bible.

The next day, a panel of three people interviewed me. The panel only asked one nursing question, and I completely drew a blank. I could not come up with an intelligent response. I answered incorrectly and completely missed basic nursing. My response clearly showed the panel I was not the right person for the job. The panel was so shocked at my poor response that all three did not know what to say.

They looked at me strangely, shocked at how badly the interview went compared to my resume. I came out of the interview devastated and upset because I usually interview well. I prayed and expressed my heart to the Lord; I told Him I was holding Him to His Word. I tried to have faith, but my heart was devastated and doubted.

I emailed Human Resources to ask for a second opportunity at another interview for the same job. I tried to convince them that despite my not-great interview, I was a good nurse and capable. But I did not get a response.

One week later, on a Sunday, my husband was driving us home after church, and my phone rang. I usually don't answer phone numbers I do not know, but something told me to answer the phone. Human Resources was on the phone! Initially, I thought the gentleman was providing me with a new interview time, and I was astonished he was working on a Sunday, as Human Resources is a Monday to Friday-job. When I asked the man when my new interview would be, he became very confused about why I was asking for an interview when he was calling to offer me the job!

Praise be to God. They offered me the job with no credit of my own. I had completely messed up for this amazing, sought-after nursing job. I relied on my ability, but God showed me it has nothing to do with me or my ability; it is only by His Amazing Grace.

God has given me one of the best nursing jobs, and I am grateful for it every day.

Here is an excerpt from Brother Emmanuel Tombe's sermon 'Youth in the Economy of God' at Perfect Love Tabernacle Youth Service on Sunday, June 02, 2024.

And now you, the young people, are dealing with Tic-Tac, YouTube, Instagram, you name it. We can't pretend that these things don't exist. It will be foolish to think that these things don't exist. But how do we navigate through all of this? And so, you can't pretend that they are not face with these challenges. This is the age and generation that they are born in. The question is, how do we help them through it? And so, my subject this morning is 'Youth in the Economy of God.'

Just as Satan has young people in his economy, I believe with all my heart that God today, in this tabernacle, in this congregation, has youth who are ordained for His economy. Reading from 1 Timothy 4:12, Paul advises Timothy. As the scripture says in verse 12, "Let no man despise thy youth...." I imagine he was a young man. I don't see a youth 40 years old. I doubt it.

"Let no man despise thy youth but be thou an example of the believers." In what? "In word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity." "Let no man despise thy youth." That's very important because Paul realizes Timothy, as a young man, is going to be facing older people who would look down upon him and think that because he is young, they will despise him. And that same thing is happening in the Message.

Why do you think that they are so many discouraged young people today in the Message? Is it say that God does not have gifted people? Is it say that God does not have a new generation coming up that He could lay His hands upon? It is because many times as the older ones we do things that will discourage them and then they don't want to come to church. Who are you going to blame?

Sometimes, we need to look at ourselves closely. Young people don't have the desire to come to church no more, and then we want to blame them--oh..., you backslide! Or this or that. Maybe it is your attitude at home—what they see you doing, the way you talk to them. I am talking to myself, too, today.

And you know why I said what I said a while back? Because I can relate. There were times where in your little world within you, your emotions are so locked up you don't feel like expressing them to people because you think that nobody understands you. So, you coil up and then you begin to act out those emotions. You don't say, but you act them out.

And you realize it is such a delicate stage to be in, that if as a parent, or even as a minister, as a pastor, or whatever it might be, if you don't have the discernment to sometimes pull back and reflect what could be going on in their world.

We want to impose a one-solution, but as Paul was telling Timothy, "Don't let any man despise thy youth." And we are here to encourage our young people, not to discourage them. Praise God.

We are here to encourage them; make them feel like they are understood--the things that they are going through. Praise God!

Brother Branham said in the message, Come, Follow Me 63-0601

These young ones sitting here tonight, But I realize, Lord, something that happened just a few hours before that great shock, or great blast, had taken place in the mountain up there north of Tucson, when the angels of the Lord came down. I remember what was said and especially about the young people.

If the coming down of the angels, the message includes an address or a message for the young people. I don't know what the message was. Brother Branham didn't say what it was, so I can't probe into it. But just taking the thought that God is mindful of the young people. It means that there is something we must pay attention to.

And Brother Branham said, "I pray thee Lord to help us to understand, and may I be able to say something to these young folks tonight that will help along the journey. For, Lord, we all need that help this time."

People fail us, parents fail us, the system fail us, our judgment fails us, and, worse of all we sometimes fail ourselves. We fail to make the right choice. When it happens, we have to lay down our expectations and put them in the Lord. He is the only one who will never fail us.

The only way to survive these times of great loss, disappointment, or failure, and see a reversal in what is happening, is to surrender them to God, lift your heart and hands to Him, and praise Him in the midst of it all. Thank Him that He is all-powerful, all-loving, all-knowing, all-seeing, all-caring, and all-encompassing. Thank Him that He is sovereign and knows the end from the beginning.

What we see as going wrong is often God's opportunity to do something great in our life. Our disappointment, losses, and failures don't have to destroy our future. When we worship Him, we invite Him to rule instead. When we praise Him in our failure, He uses His transforming power to work redemption and restoration in our life. He is a Redeemer and can redeem our greatest disappointments. We will never be disappointed in Him.

When you worship God for who He is and thank Him for His great plan of redemption in your situation, you will see His glory revealed as He brings good out of it.

Even though loss, disappointment, or failure can be crippling, don't allow your faith in the goodness of God and His love for you to waver. His promise to you is that "all things work together for good." (Romans 8:28). That means that something good will come out of even your tragedy. God's love, grace, and mercy assure us that even though we endure deep sorrow, "joy comes in the morning." (Psalm 30:5).

They celebrated my birthday in the best way for me, as it was my best birthday ever.

15 He shall call upon me, and I will answer him: I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him and honor him.




Having Jesus in our boat (life) doesn't not mean we will not have trouble and problems/Storm. We have to remember we are living in a sinful world and storms will come our way.


